

## Abstract Submission Guidelines

### Instruction:

Abstracts must be submitted according to the ISPRS format. Authors are advised to follow the official guidelines for structuring their abstracts, which include title, authors' names and affiliations, keywords, and concise content outlining the objective, methodology, and key findings.

#### 1. Length:

- The abstract should be **250–300 words** long. It must be concise but informative enough to convey the purpose, methods, and key findings.

#### 2. Content:

- The abstract should clearly state:
  - The **problem or objective** of the research.
  - The **methods** or approach used.
  - A summary of **results** (even preliminary ones).
  - The **conclusion** or significance of the findings.

#### 3. Format:

- No figures, tables, or references are allowed.
- Use plain text without special formatting.
- Avoid acronyms unless defined on first use.

#### 4. Language:

- Abstracts must be in **English**, written in a formal academic tone.
- Ensure grammar, punctuation, and clarity.

#### 5. Submission:

- Abstracts are submitted via the conference or symposium's online system, usually as part of a structured form.
- They are used by reviewers to assess relevance and suitability.

#### 6. Review Process:

- Abstracts are peer-reviewed for clarity, relevance to the ISPRS themes, and scientific quality.
- Successful abstracts may be invited for **full paper submission** (scientific track) or **presentation only** (non-peer-reviewed track).
